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ETON COLLEGE RECORDS

The manors of Goldcliff and Coldrey, co. Monmouth

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Introduction

In 1441 Henry VI gave his assent to the appropriation of the conventual priory of Goldeliff, a cell of the abbey of Bec, by the abbey of Tewkesbury. On 2 April 1451 he granted it to Eton College. Edward IV gave it back to Tewkesbury in 1462, but in 1467 restored it to Eton¹.

Accounts of the priory are to be found in Bradney's History of Monmouthshire vol.IV pt.2, the Journal of the British Archaeological Association, New Series vol.XXXV p.102, and M. Morgan's The English Lands of the Abbey of Bec.

There are no documents at Eton of the period of the priory; but the court rolls extend back almost to the beginning of the College ownership. The manorial register in the Public Record Office gives the following information about other manorial documents relating to Goldcliff and Coldrey.

The Princess mentioned in nos. 221 and 238 was Mary Tudor, who in 1525 was sent as virtually, though not, it seems, formally, Princess of Wales, to Ludlow Castle, from which her council presided over the Welsh government. Unusual instances of female rule at a much lower level are found in no. 287, where, in a list of reeves of the second half of the eighteenth century, no less than six names of women appear.

He had refused to accept the rent in money and had demanded it in kind, and the then Edward Morgan had consented to pay the same as had William Morgan, his son, father of Edward Morgan, the defendant.
